“Charlotte Rutter, Opal's sister, was not a Christian when she started helping Opal teach us. Opal treated her with dignity and respect and let her assist her as Opal taught us. As a young gradeschool student, I was overjoyed at having a teacher on Wednesday nights. Some church hardliners complained that we should be in the sanctuary hearing the adult Bible study. It meant we'd actually learn children's songs and hear Bible stories on our level and not playing tic-tac-toe, dot-to-dot, or hangman while the adult Bible study was going on. Something that was clearly over our heads. I loved Opal and Charlotte. I remember the first night we went down to the basement to be in her class. The room was dirty, dark, and cold. There were spider webs hanging from the pole we were all sitting around. Opal began her children's ministry using funds out-of-pocket. The church refused to purchase materials. My parents Rev. Ralph and Doris Cordle were thrilled about the class and sent us down in support of this new children's ministry. My parents eventually pastored the Logan Church of God for 32 years, using funds out of their pockets to foot most of the churches bills for many years. I was 18 years old when God called them to Logan. Opal and Charlotte are pillars in my knowledge of God's word. They are both attributed to some of my fondest childhood memories at The Lancaster Church of God. Now known as Victory Hill Church. We'll all see you soon! Jesus is coming soon!
