Rest in heaven Gary Lynn Lingenfelter. Gone but never forgotten and forever loved & missed 5/31/1953 to 2/24/2026.

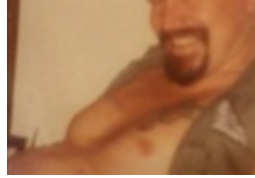

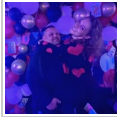
