Harold Victor “Vic” Sharb, 81, of Baltimore, Ohio, passed peacefully in his sleep on Friday, March 7, 2025, at his ‘home’ at StoryPoint Independent Living in Pickerington, Ohio.

Born December 8, 1943, at St. Ann’s Hospital in Columbus, Ohio, he was the son of the late Victor and Hazel (Crow) Sharb.
