With deep sadness, the family of Leonard Arthur Wright, Jr. announces his passing on June 4, 2016. Leonard, 72, was born in Claremont, NH on November 4, 1943 to Leonard Arthur and Dorothy Rebecca Wright. Most of his youth was spent in Contoocook, NH, graduating from Hopkinton High School in 1961 and the University of New Hampshire in 1965 with a Bachelor of Arts-Political Science degree. He then proudly served in the United States Air Force from 1966 to 1971, where he reached the rank of Captain. During his service, he fought in the Vietnam War. Leonard began his career as a sales rep for Mobil Oil. In 1977 he joined Joy Manufacturing as a sales rep for the OEM air oil separator business. It was in this role that he moved to Columbus and he would soon meet his wife, Linda. From 1994-2006 he worked for Keltec Technolab as a District Sales Manager. He finished his career working for Mann + Hummel U.S.A. as a Sales Account Manager, recruited to initiate an aftermarket air compressor filtration program. In his off-hours, Leonard enjoyed shooting skeet and trap with enough precision to win many tournaments. He also enjoyed woodworking and boating on Lake Erie with family and friends. Leonard is survived by his wife, Linda; two daughters, Lisa (Steve) Fields, Leslie (James) Baumann; four grandchildren, Andrew and Allison Fields, Evan and Alexander Baumann; brother, Richard (Linda) Wright; two nieces, Jennifer Falciano and Erica Weeks of California.
