



## Lucinda (Cinda) Cope Sharb

April 16, 1948 - January 22, 2018

Lucinda (Cinda) Cope Sharb, 69, of Baltimore, passed peacefully in her sleep early Monday morning, January 22, 2018, after a long and courageous fight against metastatic breast cancer.

Born April 16, 1948 at Mt. Saint Mary's Hospital in Nelsonville Ohio, she was the only child of Austin (Hod) and Betty Cope, who preceded her in death.

Cinda lived in Nelsonville her entire youth, attended and graduated from Nelsonville High School in 1966 and worked for the People's Bank on the square, and in Athens, before moving to Baltimore, Ohio, in 1977. She worked at PICO (Physicians Insurance Company of Ohio) in Pickerington for eighteen years until the office closed, eventually retiring from Diamond Power as an HR secretary in 2012.

Many will remember Cinda for her kind eyes and smile, as well as her sweet, gentle spirit. A devoted and loving wife, mother and grandmother, she attended nearly all of her children's and grandchildren's activities regardless of travel distance, even as she was enduring and fighting a horrible disease.

She is survived by her husband of fifty years, Harold (Vic) Sharb; children: Heather (Jarred) Church and Heath (Amy) Sharb; grandchildren: Madison Arent; Luke, Carly and Sophie Sharb; a special cousin, Patty Robinette; three

sister-in-laws (and husbands), three aunts, many cousins, and a sweet basset hound named Yori.

Cinda was preceded in death by her parents; a beloved aunt, Eileen (Ike) Shafer, who became like a mother to her after her own mother's untimely death; mother and father-in-law, Hazel and Victor Sharb; brother-in-law, Bob Sharb; nephew, Ted Tom; and uncles Jim Cope, Kenny Cope, Max Dewhurst, Deb Kuhn, and James Shafer.
