



## Pamela Pearl Folk

January 26, 1950 - February 15, 2016

PICKERINGTON: Pamela “Pam” Pearl (Sims) Folk, age 66, of Pickerington, passed away peacefully at her residence on February 15, 2016. She was born on January 26, 1950 in Lancaster, OH to the late Raymond E. and Laura B. Sims. She was the youngest of six children: brothers Edward (Charlotte), Donald, Raymond T. and Gary Sims, and sister, Jo Ann Gigante.

Pam grew up in Baltimore where her passion was playing ball. She was the first girl to play baseball on boys’ team in 1958. At age 15 she began coaching girls’ softball losing only 2 league games in 8 years. A graduate of Liberty Union High School Pam played softball, basketball, ran track and played the drums in the band. As a young person she was also very active in the Trinity United Church of Christ singing in the choir and participating in the Youth Fellowship. Pam was a proud life member of the Baltimore VFW Auxiliary Post #3761 since 1972, a member of the Pickerington American Legion Auxiliary Post #283 since 1990, and a member of the Moose Lodge of Pickerington. Pam lived by the motto “Don’t Quit.”

Pam was the owner and operator of Moretime Enterprises Inc. doing property title searches until she retired in 2004.

Pam is survived by her beloved husband, Gene, who was the greatest gift of her life; her children, Milton L. “Porky” (Angie) Kellner III of Baltimore and Nikki (Jason) Noland of Lancaster; her grandchildren, Dietra Azbell, Kurissa Kellner, Milton “Porky” Kellner IV, Breanna Kellner, Dalton Noland and Garret Noland. Her children and grandchildren were the greatest joys of her life. She is also

survived by step-daughters, Sandy Jewell and Machelles (Wayne) Huff both of Zanesville, numerous step-grandchildren and numerous step-great grandchildren as well as several nieces and nephews, special friends Stacy Cote and Donna Moore, special grandson Evan Martin and her K-9 companion Mr. Donald Nelson.

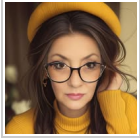

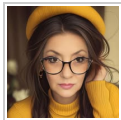


“ I don't think of Aunt Pam as gone away, her journey has just begun.
