Raymond C. "Doc" Hitchcock, age 84, born in Oil Springs (Pound Mill) KY, 7/1/34, went to be with the Lord on 3/2/19 in Col., OH. Preceded in death by parents, Haskell and Carma (Dixon) Hitchcock; first wife, Doretha; infant daughter, Tamala Jean; infant son, Paul Stanley; brothers, James Irwin and William George; sister, Virginia "Ginny" Lee.
