He was always the last one to finish his meal at dinner. He was also the last one to open gifts because he SO long to do so. He never ripped the paper. He always unwrapped it ever so meticulously. Basically his loved a life of a place for everything and everything in its place.... even when he had way too many of one thing. Lol. I'll never forget the love he had for grandma though.... 62 years together.... that's something isn't it? SIXTY TWO YEARS. I just cannot get over that. They bickered like two horses fighting over a salt lick, though and he made it very clear that he was NEVER wrong, but we all know grandma is always right. :) Alzheimer's took over my grandpa. He may not have always been there mentally because of that, because every time I saw him, you could see grandpa in his eyes. He knew who you were. He couldn't tell you, but he knew.
